She has lived in Costa Rica since childhood and studied Fine Arts with an emphasis on Sculpture. In 2003, she founded ASART, a non-profit organization that established the Artes Expresivas Latinoamérica, Study and Research Center with the European Graduate School. She co-leads the Expressive Arts, Conflict Transformation, and Peacebuilding Diploma with Victoria Uribe Jinich and holds a Master of Arts and CAGS in these fields from the same school.



Prof. Greer Essex

is the Founder and Director of the Expressive Arts Institute, San Diego, which, since 1998 with her partner David Wes Chester, has been a cooperating Institute for the EGS. A Registered Expressive Arts Therapist and Licensed Marriage and Family therapist, Judith was for many years a member of the Academy of Dance Therapist Registered with a master's degree from UCLA in Dance Therapy.

Teachers

Prof. Melinda Ashley Meyer DeMott

Dr. Meyer DeMott is the Director and Cofounder of NIKUT, a certified psychotherapist, and a Professor at the European Graduate School. She has made significant contributions to expressive arts therapy, including documentaries on refugees, research projects, and the EXIT manual. In 2023, she received Norway's Kings Medal of Merit for 30 years of impactful work.

Prof. Margareta Warja

Margareta is the Director and co-founder of Expressive Arts Stockholm, a licensed psychotherapist, music and expressive arts therapist, and musician. She is a faculty member at NIKUT and the Music Therapy Program at the Royal Academy of Music in Stockholm. She developed the KMR-Brief Music Journeys method, based on music listening and intermodal expressive arts, which showed positive results in her PhD research on cancer rehabilitation.

Prof. Victoria Uribe Jinich

has a Master's Degree in Transdisciplinary Art Therapy and Human Development from IATBA, Spain. She continued her training with the Postgraduate in Expressive Arts for Education, Therapy, and Consulting (CAGS) at the European Graduate School in Switzerland and later completed the first level of training in Emotionally Focused Therapy (EFT). in English)

Prof. Martin Zavala

is Co-founder and professor of the TAE Peru institute. He has completed postgraduate studies in expressive arts and social change at the European Graduate School in Switzerland, and in psychology at the University of Barcelona. Clinical psychologist graduated from the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru. Facilitator and supervisor in expressive arts. He has taught at the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru, the Peruvian University of Applied Sciences and at the Edith Sachs School of Fine

Prof. Ximena Maurial McKee

is a co-founder and teacher at the TAE Perú Institute. She studied expressive arts therapy at the European Graduate School and graduated in clinical psychology from the Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú. Currently training as a psychoanalyst at the Sociedad Peruana de Psicoanálisis, she works in private practice with children, adolescents, and adults. Ximena is passionate about the creative process and has participated in two painting exhibitions.
